## 1871

Attorneys George E. **Dodge** and Benjamin S. Johnson formed a partnership representing St. Louis, Iron E.B. Mountain and Southern Railroad.

# 1900s

Judge **Thomas** M. Mehaffy joined the firm along with other notable lawyers in the early 1900s, including J.E. Williams, Kinsworthy, Lee Miles, R.E. Wiley and W.R. Donham.

# 1940s

The torch was passed to a new generation, including Mehaffy's son, Pat Mehaffy, Henry Donham and Martin Fulk. They practiced in new areas of law, including insurance.

## 1952

William J. Smith and John T. Williams joined the firm, and a new partnership was formed and renamed to Mehaffy, Smith and Williams. Herschel Friday was an associate in the firm.

1953

William A. Eldredge, Jr. and Bill S. Clark joined the firm. Eldredge developed a expertise in trial work and representing railroads. Clark focused on labor relations.

# 1960

The firm, still under the name Mehaffy, Smith and Williams. expanded into new areas of law by 1960, including taxation, bonds, real estate. securities. litigation, commercial and labor law.

#### 1974

The firm formed the partnership as it is known today: Friday, Eldredge & Clark. Friday was the managing partner and chairman who led the firm's growth for the next 20 years.

## 1994

When Friday passed away unexpectedly in a plane crash, Vice Chairman William H. Sutton succeeded him as chairman and managing partner.

## 2000s

The firm continued to grow with the addition Rogers office in Northwest Arkansas.

# 2005

Byron Eiseman, **Jr.,** the firm's vice chairman and architect of the firm's taxation section and succeeded Sutton upon his retirement, becoming the 5th managing partner in the

firm.

### 2012

J. Shepherd Russell III became the managing partner when Eiseman stepped down to focus solely on his tax practice.

## 2019

Price, C. **Gardner** was named the 7th managing partner in the firm. Gardner previously served as the firm's vice chairman. Russell remains a partner and focuses on his bond practice.
